PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- **OBJECTIVE:** SUPPORT UNDERPRIVILEGED COMMUNITIES THROUGH RELIEF AND AWARENESS.
- **TARGET COMMUNITIES:** NSAN, AKPABUYO, OKOYONG
- **ACTIVITIES:** FREE MEALS, MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS, COUNSELING, AND RELIEF ITEMS.

- **2,000** FREE MEALS SERVED
- **125** FREE COUNSELING SESSIONS
- **34** INTERVIEWS CONDUCTED
- **THOUSANDS** OF INDIVIDUALS SUPPORTED
- COMMUNITY-WIDE ENGAGEMENT AND FEEDBACK COLLECTION

- **EVALUATION APPROACH:** THEMATIC ANALYSIS, NEEDS ASSESSMENT FOCUS

NSAN COMMUNITY – VOICES FROM THE GROUND

- VOCATIONAL NEEDS, POOR HEALTH, EDUCATION & INFRASTRUCTURE
- MARKET WOMEN SEEKING BUSINESS SUPPORT
- PRAISE FOR MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

AKPABUYO COMMUNITY – KEY TESTIMONIES

- VANDALIZED HEALTHCARE FACILITY
- LONG SCHOOL DISTANCES AND POOR EDUCATION
- AGRICULTURAL CHALLENGES AND LACK OF JOB OPPORTUNITIES

SUMMARY OF CHALLENGES

- INFRASTRUCTURE DEFICITS: NO ELECTRICITY, BAD ROADS, NO CLEAN WATER
- ECONOMIC HARDSHIP: UNEMPLOYMENT, LOW CAPITAL, SINGLE MOTHERS
- HEALTHCARE GAPS: NO CLINICS, LACK OF MEDICATIONS
- EDUCATION BARRIERS: LONG TRAVEL, NO SECONDARY SCHOOLS
- AGRICULTURE: LACK OF TOOLS, NO PROCESSING MILLS
- YOUTH & MENTAL HEALTH: UNEMPLOYMENT, ADDICTION

IMPACT OF THE CHALLENGES

- POOR LIVING CONDITIONS
- MATERNAL & CHILD HEALTH CRISES
- CYCLE OF POVERTY
- LIMITED EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES
- RISING MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES

SUPPORT & INTERVENTIONS NEEDED

- INFRASTRUCTURE: ELECTRICITY, ROADS, CLEAN WATER
- EDUCATION: SCHOLARSHIPS, REHAB SCHOOLS
- HEALTHCARE: CLINICS, MOBILE HEALTH UNITS
- ECONOMIC: MICROGRANTS, VOCATIONAL HUBS
- AGRICULTURE: TOOLS, TRAINING, CASSAVA MILLS

CASE STUDY: EDUCATION BARRIER

- EXAMPLE: MRS. ATIM OKON, AKPABUYO
- NO SCHOOL ACCESS, VANDALIZED INFRASTRUCTURE
- NEED: SCHOLARSHIPS, TRANSPORT SUBSIDIES, SCHOOL/HOSPITAL RESTORATION

CASE STUDY: MATERNAL HEALTH

- EXAMPLE: PATIENCE DANIEL, PREGNANT HAIRDRESSER
- NO PRENATAL CARE, HIGH MATERNAL RISKS
- NEED: CLINICS, MATERNAL CARE, HEALTH OUTREACH

CASE STUDY: ECONOMIC HARDSHIP

- EXAMPLE: GLORY WILLIAMS, FARMER & MOTHER
- RAIN-FED FARMING, NO TOOLS OR MARKETS
- NEED: MICRO-LOANS, TOOLS, IRRIGATION, MARKET ACCESS

MONITORING & EVALUATION

- QUALITATIVE TOOLS: INTERVIEWS, NARRATIVES, OBSERVATIONS
- INDICATORS: OUTPUT, OUTCOME, IMPACT
- DATA ANALYSIS: THEMATIC, COMPARATIVE, DESCRIPTIVE
